



COLLEGE AWARDS 2023/2024

The following awards are issued as part of the College Awards Evening held to recognise the achievements of students throughout the year. These awards criteria are reflective of the awards issued for Junior and Middle Secondary Students, Years 7 – 11, 2023, as well as criteria for awards relevant for Year 12, 2024. The 2023 College Awards Evening will be held in Week 7 of Term 4, 2023.

Academic Awards are awarded based on the overall achievement across the academic year leading up to the Awards Evening, Terms 1 to 3 in 2023. All Australian Curriculum subjects are weighted equally, including rotational electives in Years 7 and 8.
