2026 YEAR 9 STUDENT RESOURCE SCHEME

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THE PURPOSE OF THE STUDENT RESOURCE SCHEME (SRS)

Dear Parent / Carer,

This document includes important information about the fees and inclusions for the SRS Once you opt into the SRS at the College, your participation is assumed for the remainder of your child's enrolment, unless you inform the College otherwise by completing a new Participation Agreement Form (PAF). If you are a new parent to the College, this information will assist you in making a decision as to whether you wish to participate in the SRS.

WHAT IS PROVIDED BY THE QUEENSLAND GOVERNMENT?

The Queensland Government supports children's education by providing funding for instruction (teachers), facilities (College grounds and buildings, internet), and administration (staff to run the College). Funding for the College does not extend to individual student resources such as textbooks, equipment for personal use, and many items used by the student in the classroom.

The SRS helps parents to source these resources. The College can purchase resources at lower rates due to its bulk buying power. Resources such as textbooks or musical instruments that will be used over a period are hired to students to further reduce costs for families. Participating in the SRS also offers a convenient way for parents to source the items that their child needs for school and ensures that all students have access to the same standard of resources.

THE TYPES OF RESOURCES THAT WILL BE INCLUDED ARE:

Hired	 These items are hired to the student for use for a specific period of time (e.g., textbooks or classroom used musical instruments) Hired items MUST be returned to the College in a reasonable condition at the end of the hire period or if the student leaves the College. A repair or replacement cost may be charged to the parent if any hired items are damaged or not returned.
Used	 These items are used / consumed in class by the student (e.g., Industrial Technology / cooking / art supplies) Work/items produced from these resources will remain the property of the student.

THE FEE

Items provided by the scheme vary from owned, hired or used in class. Some examples are ID cards, textbooks or specialised equipment, stationary items, workbooks, etc. A list of items by subject/year level is available on our website.

If you are not satisfied that the SRS fee represents good value for money based on the inclusions (over the page), you may choose not to participate in the SRS. If that is the case, please complete a new Participation Agreement Form, indicating that you no longer wish to participate. If you choose not to participate, you will be provided with a detailed list of resources that you will need to provide for the student.

THE TEXTBOOK AND RESOURCE ALLOWANCE (TRA)

The Department of Education provides a Textbook and Resource Allowance (TRA) to assist parents with the cost of textbooks and other education resources for eligible Years 7 to 12 students.

For those students who are eligible to receive the TRA, the TRA will be applied to reduce the cost of participation as shown in the table below. Thus, the SRS invoice you receive will be the full cost of participation in the SRS minus the TRA already held at the College. Information on the TRA can be found on the department's website Textbook and resource allowance (education.qld.gov.au)

Please be aware that there may be two lines of charges on your invoice indicating the GST inclusive and GST exclusive fees depending on the resources supplied by the SRS.

COST BREAKDOWN

The diagram below reflects how the TRA has been deducted from the SRS fee for eligible students who have opted in to the Core SRS.



If you have opted to pay for the SRS you will be invoiced for the full amount of \$240. The following payment options are available -

- A single payment for the full year's fees
- Term instalments paid over the first 2 terms
 - o \$100 Term 1
 - o \$70 in Term 2
 - \$70 in Term 3 (see key payment dates on page 7)
- An instalment plan as negotiated with the College (e.g., direct debit, Centrepay or BPoint)



FINANCIAL DIFFICULTY

If you would like to participate, but are experiencing financial difficulties, please contact the College to arrange an appointment to discuss options. Any information that you provide will be confidential.

RELEASE OF RESOURCES

Resources will not be distributed until full fees are paid, or first instalment is paid, or a payment plan has been established. Any unpaid invoices will be managed according to the Department's Debt Management Procedure and may result in the student being excluded from the scheme and/or from participating in extracurricular activities until payments are made.

RETURN OF HIRED RESOURCES

A repair or replacement cost will be charged to the parent for any items that are damaged or not returned.

STUDENT RESOURCE SCHEME - PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT FORM

If you wish to participate in the SRS, you are required to complete, sign and return a Student Resource Scheme – Participation Agreement Form. If your child is a current student at MHSSC and you have previously opted into the SRS, your participation is assumed for the remainder of your child's enrolment unless you inform the College otherwise by completing a new Student Resource Scheme - Participation Agreement Form.

Points for your attention- (Refer to page 2 of Student Resource Scheme – Participation Agreement Form)

- **15.** Parents who choose **not** to participate in the SRS are responsible for providing their student with all items that would otherwise be provided to the student by the SRS to enable their student to engage with the curriculum.
- **18.** As the SRS operates for the benefit of participating parents and is funded from participation fees, SRS resources will not be issued to students whose parents choose not to participate in the SRS.

NON-SRS PARTICIPATING STUDENTS

If you opt not to participate in the Student Resource Scheme, students in Year 7 to 12 will be required to provide all textbooks and other resources required for the subject that are in addition to College provided resources. Lists are provided below.

An additional invoice will be created for non-participating students when teacher created resources are provided instead of textbooks or other resources in a particular subject.

2026 YEAR 9 – IPAD AND STATIONERY REQUIREMENTS

Having the right equipment can have a major impact on a student's success in Junior Secondary. Please read the following information and help your child get off to a great start at the College.

One of the biggest challenges teachers face with Junior Secondary is students arriving at College without the proper equipment for all subjects. For some students, this is a new and major organisational challenge after being used to keeping all materials in the one classroom. While they are learning self-organisation skills, we would appreciate your help with reminding students to pack their pencil case, exercise books, laptop/device and other equipment as required each morning. Please ensure all stationery items are always labelled and stored in a pencil case.

IPAD DEVICE AND BYOX

At Mango Hill State Secondary College, we utilise an iPad device to enhance the learning in all of our classrooms. The College's pedagogy and curriculum is specifically designed to facilitate deeper engagement in the learning process, access higher order thinking skills and accelerate student-driven learning.

All students are expected to have their iPad at the College fully charged, with enough space to save class work and install apps and books for educational and classroom purposes. In using their iPad, all students must abide by the MHSSC Student Code of Conduct and BYOx Charter.

A full app list and BYOx Charter will be distributed to current students at the end of 2025 and all new students on their first day at the College. Please see our website for further information.

- Previously purchased models including 7th or 8th generation iPads for continuing students are still adequate devices for 2026. Devices require at minimum iOS version 15.0 to onboard, though students will benefit from having the latest iOS version 18.0. Note that software and apps must be maintained as per charter expectations, and adequate storage space for learning apps and classwork is required.
- The screen size of the <u>iPad Mini</u> limits learning tasks as they increase in depth and complexity. It does
 not support teaching and learning needs of students at the College and is <u>not compatible</u> with NAPLAN
 Online.

We do not recommend the purchase of a cellular enabled device.

- A Wi-Fi only model will reduce the cost of the device significantly without compromising the student's ability to complete college tasks.
- Students are required to access the internet and resources through the College's Wi-Fi network only
 while at the College. <u>Use of cellular data while at college is in breach of the College's Student Code of</u>
 Conduct

Compatible headphones may be used to in a variety of subjects and are required as part of NAPLAN Assessment. It is **strongly recommended** that when purchasing headphones that they are corded (can connect physically to the iPad)

2026 iPad Accessories Year 7 to Year 9

An Apple Pencil or similar stylus allows students to annotate on screen, take notes, sketch ideas, mark up documents and show working out and thinking during the learning process. There are various models and price points that will allow students to engage with 'hands on' annotations across their junior subject areas. 'Palm Rejection' capacity is a highly recommended feature and model compatibility should be referenced when purchasing.
