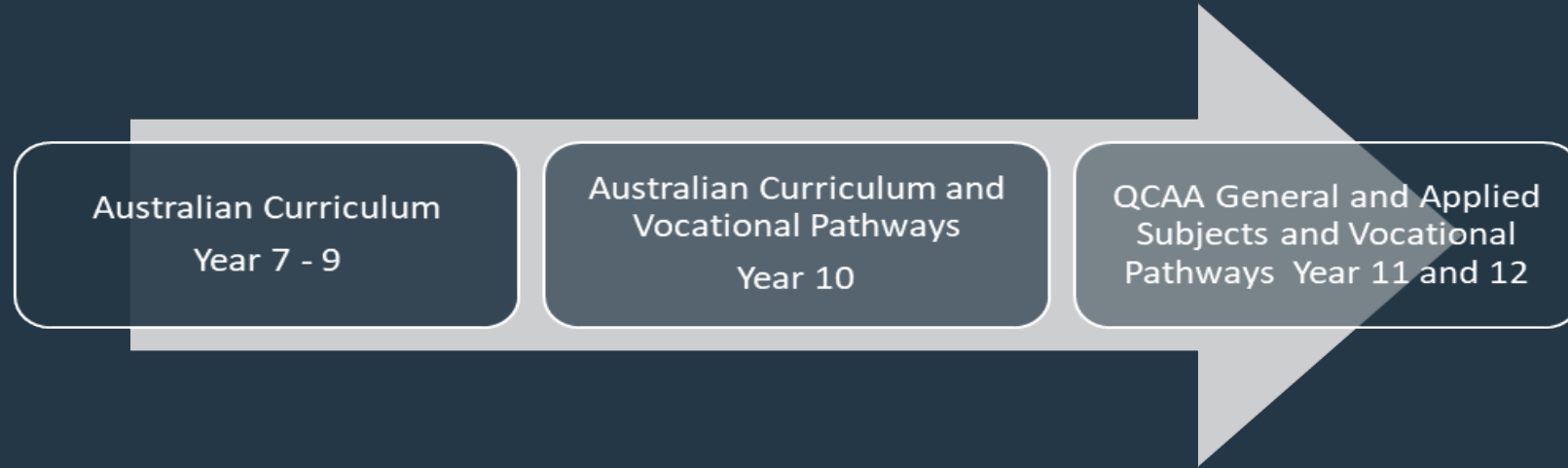

- ▶ Are provided as part of the Australian Curriculum – with increasing choice from Year 7 – 10
- ▶ Provide the foundation needed to be successful in future subjects
- ▶ Support students to align their choices to a possible pathway for Year 11/12
- ▶ Aligned to the resourcing requirements of a growing College

Preference Subjects



- ▶ In addition to the four electives chosen –students must choose 2 x preference subjects
- ▶ Preference subjects are **RESERVE subjects**
 - ▶ Students select subjects they would be willing to study if they cannot be placed into their chosen electives

Why do we ask for reserve subjects?

From student selections – we build the timetable lines for both Year 9 and Year 10. We align our timetable with the interest of students, and the resourcing capacity of the College.

If a reserve subject is needed – we will meet with students in Term 4 to review their selections.

Making the right choice



When making subject choices at the Year 10 juncture, students should ask themselves the following questions:

- ▶ What subjects do I enjoy?
- ▶ What subjects do I perform well in?
- ▶ What possible Careers am I interested in?
- ▶ What possible Year 11/12 subjects am I interested in?
- ▶ What courses post Year 12 am I interested in? (e.g. University courses)
- ▶ What Year 11/12 subjects do I need as tertiary pre-requisites and how could my Year 10 choices support this pathway?
- ▶ Am I interested in pursuing a trade or apprenticeship? After school or as a school-based option?
- ▶ What grades do I need to obtain to meet the recommendations for Year 11 and 12 subjects?

Common Mistakes When Choosing Subjects:



- ▶ Choosing a subject **because your friend chose it**
- ▶ Choosing subjects **so you can avoid, or have, a particular teacher**
- ▶ Choosing a subject because **someone told you that you had to**
- ▶ Choosing a subject **because you think it will be easy**

Result Recommendations

- ▶ Recommendations associated with some Year 10 and Year 11/12 subjects that are reflective of **the academic results a student should be demonstrating in order to select the given subject.**
- ▶ These are intentional, and founded on an understanding of the level of achievement and prior knowledge a student needs in order to be successful in a subject.
- ▶ Students most recent Semester results are used to assess if they are currently meeting a result recommendation prior to subject selections.
 - ▶ Students who do not meet a result recommendation are encouraged to communicate early with Heads of Department to discuss the suitability of their intended subject choices.

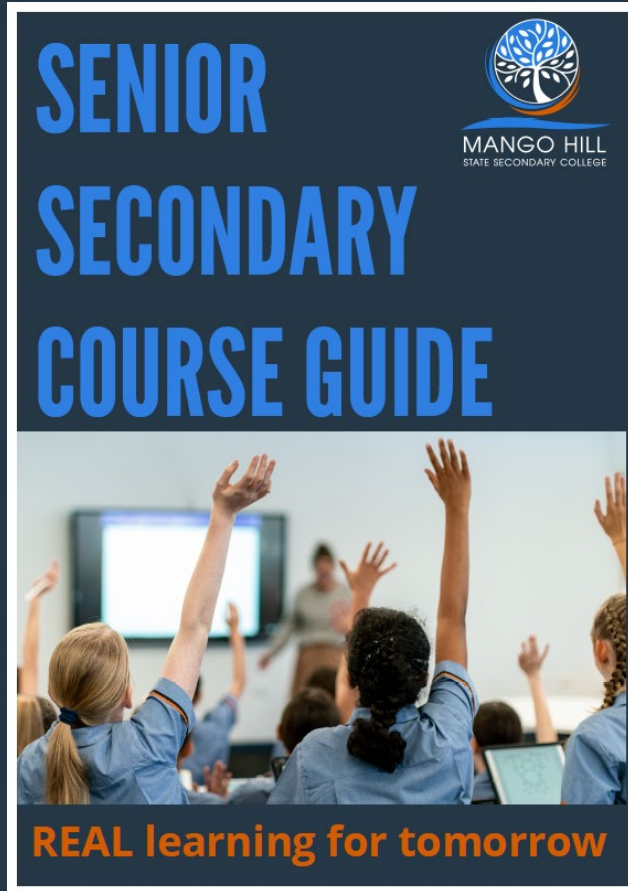

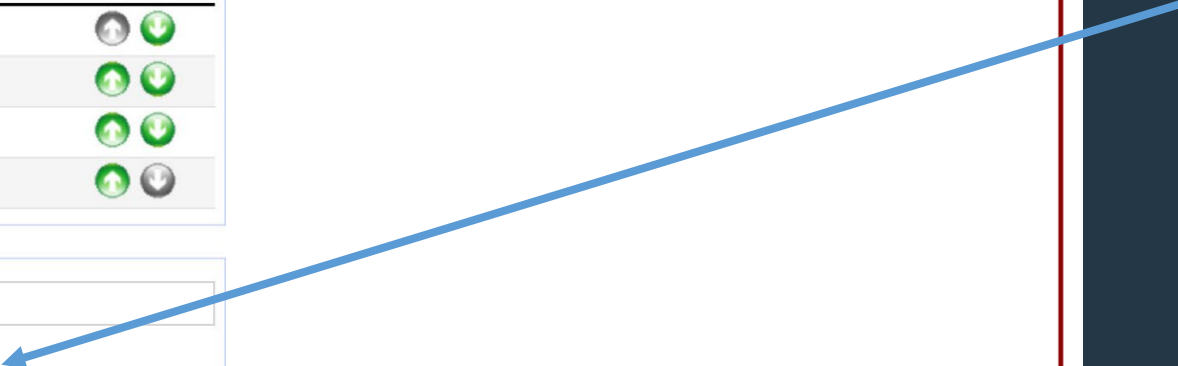

Students must select an offering on each line. Line 1 - 3 relates to the choice of core or extension for English, Mathematics and Science.

Line 4 - 7 are elective lines. Students must select 4 electives to study in Year 10 2022 - one from each line. Each elective is studied for one semester. You will be allocated two electives in Semester 1, and 2 Electives in Semester 2.

You must selective a subject only once, with the exception of Italian. Students wishing to study Italian must select Italian in Line 4, and Italian Semester 2 in Line 5.

2 Preferences must be listed. These are subjects students would want to study if the subjects they have chosen are unable to be offered to them in 2022.
